Countywide Grants

The Marin County Office of Education supports our educators, students and administrators through various type grants in the areas of education services, professional development, special education and alternative education.

Education service grants include:

- Early Implementer Grant - To support teacher professional development – grant with CCSESA
- PK3-QI Coordination Grant – Grant from Marin Community Foundation (MCF) to support Multi-Year initiative for quality preschool and targeted support for early education
 - Funding has been leveraged in the area of Preschool through access to additional funding from state/federal grant QRIS and IMPACT
 - The targeted early education focus, First School, has been leveraged in specific districts to expand to higher grades and increase district school participation.
- Arts Grant – MCF and Hewlett Foundation have provided targeted funding to support arts integration and a map for arts education across the county
- Countywide Wellness – In collaboration with Kaiser and County of Marin we have received targeted funds to support identified schools in building capacity locally for health and wellness awareness
- KSEP Pilot – First 5 Marin has funded a pilot program to implement a countywide research based validated screening tool for Kindergarten, this was piloted in 4 districts and 5 schools across the county with possibly additional piloting in fall 2018
- One Marin 2.0 – Collaborative initiative with Marin Interfaith Council, MCOE and MCF to hold a convening of local leaders that represent all sectors in our community. The purpose of this grant

is to build relationships and to identify where we might find increased alignment with our focus and work around equity and anti-bias.

Workforce Development

Marin County Office of Education focuses on building local workforce on behalf of students, classified and certificated employees to provide meaningful employment, education and training opportunities through state and local funding. State and federal funding has allowed Marin County Office of Education to increase and train the local workforce in a variety of areas, some of which include:

- New teacher Induction – offering 1-2 year program for new teachers to support competing their preliminary credential
- Marin Leadership Institute – collaboration with San Francisco State University to recruit and train local educational leaders in Marin to be administrators
- Classified School Employee Teacher Credentialing Program – offering a multi-year grant through the Commission on Teaching Credentialing (CTC) to support current classified staff obtain their teaching credential
- Early Childhood Workforce Development – grant with MCF and Community Action Marin to increase workforce of early childhood educators to obtain further certification in the area of Early Childhood Education

Innovative Learning Team of Marin (ILT-M)

The ILT-M is a collaborative of instructional leaders with an intentional focus on transforming education through sustainable professional development and support systems. Discussions include teacher training to promote student engagement and meaningful learning. Members include district superintendents and curriculum and instruction administrators.

- Monthly collaboration among countywide curriculum leaders to support professional growth for all engaged educators across the county
- The group provides opportunities for districts across the county to share in collective professional development and co-facilitate workshops for local educators
- Various sub-committees of the ILT-M include, but are not limited to the coaching consortium, Equity Committee and Arts Committee.
