### Emergency Preparedness

As an update to the report provided at the Efficiency & Effectiveness meeting of October 11, 2017 on Emergency Preparedness below is an example of how the Marin County Office of Education works with Marin County School Districts to support Emergency Preparedness in Schools.

Prompted by the October 2017 Northern California wildfires, the Marin County Office of Education has been in contact with Keenan and Associates to form a partnership to support a coordinated approach to conducting a Wildfire Risk Assessment for all Marin County Schools.

Keenan and Associates presented at the Marin Schools Emergency Preparedness Council (MSEPC) on November 9, 2017 on the North Bay Wildfires and discussed steps and best practices that Marin County Schools can take to prepare for the threat of wildfires.

In addition, Keenan and Associates have offered to help support and participate in a campus walkthrough at each school site in Marin County to review site-specific risks and to develop steps to take in order to mitigate hazards and increase preparedness. With a systematic approach, the Wildfire Risk Assessment walkthrough of all Marin County Schools is expected for completion by June 30, 2018. The Marin County Office of Education will continue to provide updates to Superintendents on the plan for the School Site Wildfire Risk Assessment.

### School/Law Enforcement Partnership (SLEP)

The goal of the Marin County School/Law Enforcement Partnership, a collaboration of schools, law enforcement, and community agencies, is to encourage and support a countywide effort to keep Marin schools and communities as safe and healthy environments for all students and families.

Marin County SLEP has been operating for 20 plus years and has promoted and provided programs and activities designed to support safe and drug free schools and communities for all Marin County students and their families. The School/Law Enforcement Partnership is co-chaired by the Marin County Sheriff (Robert T. Doyle) and the Marin County Office of Education (Mary Jane Burke).
